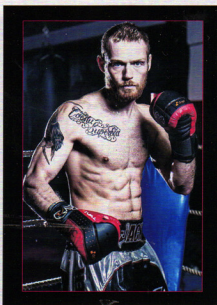


Myer & Jack Budovitch Memorial Award

It's been said that "boxing is a sport where you experience many defeats, but you cannot be defeated".

Fredericton based fighter Brandon Brewer has been fortunate to avoid any defeats in the ring. He's 17-0-and-1 as a professional fighter, and is a two-time Canadian Light Middleweight Champion.

It was an incident outside the ring that started him down his current path.

Brewer admits to being a wild partier in his younger days in Prince William, but that all changed after he got alcohol poisoning and developed an ulcer when he was 23 years old.

After getting sober, he joined a boxing club and got hooked on the sweet science.

Despite getting a late introduction to the sport, the results speak for themselves.

Although he is a Canadian Boxing champion, Brandon says it's still a constant struggle on many levels. He is making sacrifices in every aspect of his life from missing family and social events for nonstop training to giving up employment and struggling financially so he can achieve his goal of becoming world champion. The resiliency and prowess required in the ring has even translated into his own fan club called "the Plaid Army".
