Fredericton's Athlete of the Year for 2013 may have gotten her start on the soccer fields of the Capital City but her biggest success has come more than 12-hundred kilometres from her hometown.

Dayle Colpitts is the goaltender of the Virginia Tech Hokies, Division-One women's soccer team. The 4th year netminder led the Hokies to their first Final-Four appearance in women's soccer in school history. Even though they lost in the semi-finals, 3-2 to Florida State, it was a great season for Colpitts. She set Virginia Tech single-season records for shutouts with 11, wins with 19 and had a 0.77 goals-against-average. The team had 19 wins, 5 losses and 3 ties.

With a strong academic standing, she was also named to the NCAA Atlantic Coast Conference's All Academic team.

She holds career records at Virginia Tech with 29 shutouts, 46 wins, a 1.15 goals against average and a total of 7, 329 minutes played.

Colpitts is a product of the Fredericton District Soccer Association.

She starred at Fredericton High School and suited up for the New Brunswick Canada Games team before being named to the National Under-20 Women's Team, and eventually the Canadian National Team. The recipient of the 2013 Myer and Jack Budovitch Award goes to soccer keeper
Dayle Colpitts.
